# **Lateral Transfer**

What do you do in your chapter when you have a devoted sister who simply can't make it to your regular chapter meetings? It is a hard issue because none of us want to lose a sister in any way. We fight vigilantly to keep our sweet sisters.

But what is our responsibility? Our ultimate responsibility is to our Sisterhood. We need to encourage each of our sisters to be involved, participating and contributing to our Sisterhood. We pledge to devote a due share of our interest and energy to the Sisterhood at our initiation.

So, if you have a sister that cannot participate due to work schedules, children, etc., please suggest the possibility of a lateral transfer, which is simply transferring to another local chapter, which better fits her needs. Find chapters in your local area that might be a good fit - tell them about your sister, tell your sister about their chapter and encourage consideration of a lateral transfer.

If we encourage lateral transfers, when appropriate, we are helping to strengthen the Sisterhood and our ultimate goals.

A lateral transfer is not a loss to your chapter, but a positive move for our Sisterhood and our mission. It's all about what we can do as individuals, as chapters, and as a Sisterhood to make a difference in this world for women and education.

**Question:** Now that we have our unaffiliate list highlighted with the names of potential sisters who live in our area, we are well on our way to contacting them. We notice most of our phone calls are unanswered and we must leave a phone message. Is there a perfect message to leave?

Dear Daisy **Answer:** How exciting that you are locating and contacting these sisters! If no one is available to answer the call, just leave a message after the beep. You may share that her name was found on the International Unaffiliate listing used by your chapter to find sisters who may be looking for a new chapter. Leave your number and brief information about your chapter meetings.

If you don't hear back just remember sometimes phone messages may not get to the intended person so, try again later. Now, wait for that wonderful return phone call!
